

## COMMUNICATION AU PERSONNEL N° CJ 19/18

Advocate General Michal Bobek is looking for a suitable candidate to fill the position of legal secretary (référendaire) in his chambers as from January 2019.

This is a unique opportunity to join a dynamic international team and contribute to high level analysis and development of European Union law. The main tasks are independent legal research, analysis, drafting, and follow up of assigned cases, as well as discussion and collaboration with colleagues on other cases being dealt within the chambers and the Court.

The pre-requisites for this role are the holding of a law degree, with further (postgraduate) studies in EU law considered an asset. The candidate should have at least several years of previous practical legal experience (in any legal profession), and expertise in the areas of European economic law, market regulation, or tax law.

The working language of the chambers is English. For many questions, the working language of the Court of Justice is French. Thus, an excellent knowledge of English and a working knowledge of French are required. Knowledge of any other Union language is considered as an asset.

The nature of the role requires an excellent ability to analyse and synthesise; a high level of independence and critical thinking when confronted with complex legal problems; successful management of a high workload; attention to detail; a high level of precision and clarity in English; as well as respect for deadlines. An open mind and the ability to cooperate in an international environment are essential.
